C1 – MOTION TO APPROVE: Minutes of Planning Technical Advisory Committee Meeting of September 18, 2013

Mr. Jeff Weidner made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Jonathan Roberson. The motion was called to a vote and carried unanimously.

R1. – MOTION TO ENDORSE: Resolution Supporting Tri-Rail Coastal Link to Enter Into the Project Development Phase

The committee briefly discussed the past Tri-Rail Coastal Link (TRCL) memorandum of understanding (MOU) that was approved throughout the region earlier in 2013 and the development of the current TRCL resolution of support. Explanation was given that the TRCL resolution was going to the region’s three MPOs, two RPCs, and SFRTA Governing Board as an action item over next 30 days.

Mr. Jeff Weidner made a motion to endorse the resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Phil Steinmiller. The motion was called to a vote and carried unanimously by the PTAC.

INFORMATION / PRESENTATION ITEMS

I1. - INFORMATION: Railroad Crossing Delay and Truck Volume Monitoring

Mr. Jeff Weidner of FDOT District 4 and Mr. Stewart Robertson of consultant Kimley Horn & Associates gave a detailed presentation on the department’s efforts to monitor and track growth in freight movements (for both rail and truck) throughout the region. They cited extensive data, included as links in the meeting agenda package, throughout the presentation. Key points made were that in 2006, the District established

static classification count locations so that Truck Counts could be obtained at the same location on an annual basis. In addition, in 2012 the District funded a study to look at all of these locations (197) and analyze growth rates and patterns that will be useful in transportation planning. At same time, the District was seeking a methodology to monitor rail activity's impacts on cross street delay. A number of detection and information sources were attempted and the District finally went with video data collection. The detection devices were used to collect data at 12 locations along the SFRC and FEC corridors and that was expanded to 20 locations in 2012.

12. - INFORMATION: Uptown Link/Cypress Creek Midday Shuttle Service

A brief overview was given of the recent award by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) of a Transit Corridor Grant to the City of Fort Lauderdale for midday shuttle service originating from the Cypress Creek Tri-Rail Station. The proposed midday shuttle would serve the Cypress Creek Road and Commercial Boulevard corridors as well as the Uptown Business District and the several major employment and educational facilities in these areas.

It was noted that the City of Fort Lauderdale, FDOT and SFRTA will continue to work collaboratively in planning and community outreach efforts. SFRTA has an existing shuttle bus operations contract that enables the service to be added quickly and efficiently, pending SFRTA Governing Board approval. The grant is projected to cover total costs of approximately two years of service and is scheduled to be operational in February 2014. Approvals by the SFRTA Board and City of Fort Lauderdale are anticipated in January.

13. - INFORMATION: Hollywood/Pines Corridor Project

Mr. James Cromar, of the Broward Metropolitan Organization (MPO), along with Ms. Jessica Vargas, Tindale-Oliver & Associate gave a presentation on the Hollywood/Pines Corridor Project. It was noted that this is the first planning effort from the MPO to combine the Congestion Management Process and Livability Planning as a comprehensive approach to implementing the Broward MPO 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The intent of the Hollywood/Pines Corridor Project is to improve safety and mobility along this corridor resulting in short- and long-term strategies and improvements for land use, transit, biking, and walking.

The Hollywood/Pines Corridor Project has resulted in shorter-term multimodal infrastructure and congestion management project recommendations, as well as longer-term concepts for improvements to the transportation system. Some of the shorter-term congestion management recommendations mentioned include: the provision of bicycle and pedestrian facilities along Hollywood/Pines Boulevard as well as along supporting parallel and perpendicular roadways; Bus stop enhancements and re-positioning of bus stops to provide safer, more convenient access to signalized intersections; Implementation of pedestrian-friendly design treatments at major intersections and interchanges; Recommendations related to specific, observed traffic safety issues including improvements to street lighting and traffic signal operational modifications; Identification of potential traffic operational improvements including additional applications for FDOT District 4's Transportation System Management and Operations projects to provide Arterial Traffic Management Systems.

14. - INFORMATION: Seven 50 (Southeast Florida Prosperity Plan)

There was brief committee discussion on the draft report of the Seven 50 Southeast Florida Prosperity Plan. A key recommendation of the Seven 50 Plan is an expanded premium transit network in the future. A discussion by the PTAC led to the suggestion by Mr. Weidner that the committee identify other state DOTs which provide funding for transit operations. Scope development and literature review for this effort will be discussed further at upcoming PTAC meetings.

15. - INFORMATION: Draft 2014 PTAC Meeting Calendar

Committee consensus was reached on a reduced meeting schedule in 2014, which will be coordinated with the SEFTC Regional Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (RTTAC) and Tri-Rail Coastal Link Finance Sub-Committee. In 2014, PTAC meetings are scheduled to occur in January, March, May, June, September, and November. Dates were identified in February and August as placeholders in case additional meetings were required.

UPDATE ON JOB ACCESS REVERSE COMMUTE (JARC)
AND NEW FREEDOM (NF)

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) and New Freedom (NF) are two programs administered by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The JARC program has assisted individuals successfully transitioning from welfare to work by addressing the unique transportation challenges faced by welfare recipients and low-income persons seeking to get and keep jobs. The NF program was established to support new public transportation services and public transportation alternatives beyond those required by the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990. SFRTA has been the region's designated recipient for the JARC and NF programs since 2009.

The most recent selection process, to distribute FY 2012 funds, resulted in the selection of eight JARC and seven NF projects by the SFRTA Board. Selected projects were then sent to FTA for final review and approval.

SFRTA staff will give a brief update on the status of these grants and outline next steps.

NEW SFRTA/TRI-RAIL NORTHERN LAYOVER FACILITY

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

SFRTA has been conducting a detailed planning analysis for a potential new Tri-Rail northern layover and light maintenance facility in Palm Beach County since 2010. The proposed new facility would accommodate storage for up to nine 5-car train sets, allowing for more efficient Tri-Rail operations and capacity that will allow for the anticipated expansion of service onto the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railway corridor.

Periodic updates to the PTAC and various other transportation partners have been provided throughout the project's planning process. A brief update on the latest northern layover facility happenings will be provided to the PTAC on January 7. The update will include details on some significant milestones for the project that were reached in late 2013 related to environmental clearance and funding. Activities planned for 2014, such as continued municipal coordination and start of the design phase, will also be discussed.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

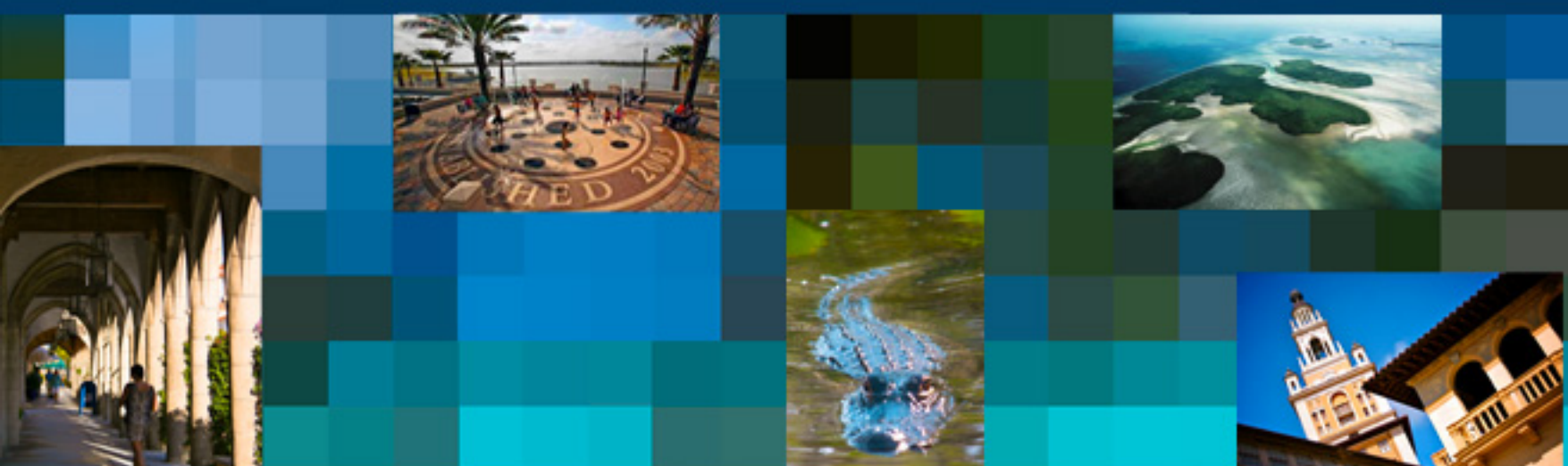
